

**Fr Frank Brennan,
Jesuit priest**
responds to the
question:
**“How does Ignatian
spirituality inform my
political activity?”**



Frank Brennan joined the Society of Jesus in Australia in 1975. He is an example of a Jesuit after Ignatius' heart – passionate in bringing the values of Christ into the world for the good of all.

Fr Frank is professor at the P M Glynn Institute at the Australian Catholic University and research professor at the Australian Centre for Christianity and Culture. He has been a member of the Turnbull Government's expert panel conducting the Religious Freedom Review.

He is an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) for services to Aboriginal Australians, particularly as an advocate in the areas of law, social justice and reconciliation. The National Trust has classified him as a Living National Treasure, while during the 1998 Wik debate, Paul Keating labelled him "the meddling priest".

His research interests include conscience and faith, human rights and the rule of law, and the rights of Indigenous peoples and asylum seekers.
